Behavioral Health. 106 Blossom Lane: Remodel of existing building in progress.

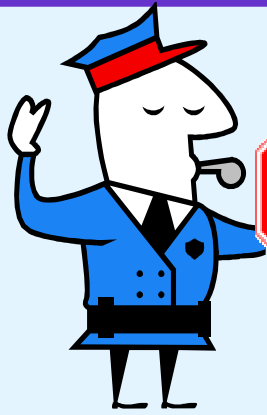
Community Center Town Beach Lot: Footers being constructed. Construction under way !!!

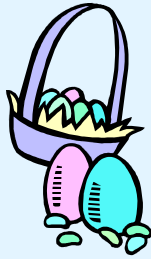

ACCREDITATION TEAM INVITES PUBLIC COMMENTS ABOUT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

A team of assessors from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) will arrive April 11 to examine all aspects of the Police Department. Accreditation is a highly prized recognition of law enforcement professional excellence, and involves compliance with 272 standards, many of which are critical to life, health, and safety issues.

As part of the on-site assessment, the general public is invited to offer comments to the assessment team. On April 12 from 1-5 p.m. you can call (561) 844-0138, or mail your comments to: CFA, 3504 Lake Lynda Dr. Suite 380, Orlando, FL 32817. Calls are limited to 10 minutes and must address the agency's ability to comply with CFA standards. A copy of the standards is available through the PBS Public Information Officer at (561) 844-3460.

Town Updates

You may have noticed an additional worker around our public works department recently. We currently have a contract maintenance service assisting with specific work related to the police accreditation, as well additional special projects. Part of this work includes the replacement of our irrigation posts throughout the parkway that were damaged or destroyed during Hurricane Wilma. Fortunately this additional assistance will allow us to address numerous projects 'on the list' over the next few weeks.

The Inlet Park project is moving forward with a request for bid currently underway. Bid closing is scheduled for April 10th and the results will be presented to the Commission at the April 17th Regular Commission meeting. At that time Commission will be considering award of various elements to be constructed at the west end of the project. The current projected timeline anticipates work starting mid-June.

Staff has been working with the Property Owner's Association Environmental Committee to compile a plan for tree replacement throughout Town. The goal will be to present recommendations to the Commission during the budget process for consideration. Tree trimming will also be taking place throughout Town within the next few months. The Town will be going out for bids for tree trimming by mid-April.

As you can see we have a lot going on and we ask for your patience as we work to address numerous projects currently underway.

NOTES FROM THE CLERK

Town Charter requires that the Town Commission "reorganize" itself every year on the 4th Monday of March. This meeting follows the local March election each year. This year, seats held by two Commissioners (Lisa Tropepe and John Mitchell) and Mayor (Thomas Mills) were up for election. Since there were no opposing candidates for these seats, the three incumbents remained in their respective positions. Mayor Mills and Commissioner Tropepe were sworn in at the March 27th meeting. Commissioner Mitchell was out of town, but will be sworn in at or before the April Commission meeting.

Other business at the reorganization meeting included choosing a Vice Mayor (Thomas Sullivan), reappointing the Town Clerk/Treasurer (Carolyn Gangwer), Police Chief/Civil Defense Officer (Roger Wille) and Fire Chief (Larry Fauci). In addition, Cindy Lindskoog was appointed as Town Administrator and Corbett and White were appointed as the Town's Attorney.

Planning and Zoning Board members were voted on and appointed: Roby DeReuil, Alan Fiers, Kevin Banks, Carol Hurst and Fred Hampf. Richard Laabs was appointed as an alternate member.

Attorney Keith Davis of Corbett & White gave a brief legal update to the Mayor and Commissioners on issues such as the Sunshine Law, quasi judicial hearings, conflicts of interest, etc.
